## Frequently Asked Questions

---

**Am I eligible for the B.A.S. program?**

Yes, if you have completed your A.S. degree since 2000—those who completed their A.S. before 2000 need 36 hours of general education requirements for admission.

**When should I apply? And how?**

As early as one year prior to the semester you wish to enroll. You can submit an application online at [www.admissions.ucf.edu](http://www.admissions.ucf.edu).

**Do I need to complete my A.S. degree prior to applying?**

We strongly recommend it, but you can indicate on your application when you plan to finish your A.S. degree.

**How do credits from my A.S. degree apply toward the B.A.S. degree?**

Your A.S. degree is transferred as a complete package, and you will start the program as either a junior or senior. UCF evaluates your credits to see if you need any additional general education courses or requirements.

**Will I need additional General Education courses?**

All bachelor's degree programs at Florida public institutions require 36 hours of General Education credits. Consult with a UCF Regional Campuses advisor to discuss acceptable General Education courses. Students will be allowed to complete the required General Education courses at the community college after transfer to UCF. All transfer credit for the university's General Education Program is subject to final approval by the Office of Academic Services. This degree allows you to complete the program, including the remaining General Education classes, within approximately 120 overall hours.

**Will I need to take a Foreign Language course?**

All students graduating from UCF must complete two years of the same foreign language in high school or two semesters of college-level foreign language (or proficiency exam) prior to graduation. Students entering UCF with no foreign language will be allowed to complete these courses at the community college while completing course work in the B.A.S. degree.

**How long will it take to complete my degree?**

That depends on you and your schedule—it's up to you. UCF provides access to convenient times and locations, so it's flexible and lets you enroll full- or part-time.

**What will my diploma say?**

Bachelor of Applied Science.

**Will financial assistance be available?**
